Student Delegate Guidelines

Introduction

In 2013, the Board of Directors of the Maine Society of Radiologic Technology (MSRT) approved the appointment of 1 eligible student from each class in the medical imaging and radiation therapy programs in the state of Maine to a position of non-voting member of the MSRT. This will be referred to as a student delegate position to the Maine Society of Radiologic Technology. Only one student from each class in the program will be accepted per year. The appointment will be made annually. If there are more applicants per class alternate positions will be considered.

Goals of the Program

1. To have a student representative from each program who will communicate and promote the MSRT to their peers.
2. To develop future leaders for the Maine Society of Radiologic Technology.
3. To enhance student representation at the MSRT.
4. To promote student leadership skills.
5. To promote student's ability to network with other professionals in the fields of medical imaging and radiation therapy.

Responsibilities

1. Students are expected to attend at least 3 MSRT meetings a year. Attendance may be in person, via video conferencing, or conference call.
2. Students are expected to promote student participation in the MSRT and serve as a liaison for other students in the state of Maine and the MSRT.
3. Students are to be active participants in the MSRT and complete assignments prior to the deadline.



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4. Students are expected to provide feedback and actively strive to work with other board members to enhance membership for students and others.
5. Attendance at the annual MSRT Spring meeting will be encouraged with active participation.
6. Students will work with the Student Liaison and other members of the MSRT to help with student activities and other responsibilities at the annual MSRT Spring meeting or at other times throughout the year.

Benefits

1. The MSRT will appoint a person to facilitate active participation in the society.
2. The MSRT will nominate 1-2 students to participate in the ASRT Student Leadership Development Program (SLDP). These students will attend the ASRT SLDP at its annual meeting, expenses paid by the ASRT as indicated on the ASRT website.
3. The MSRT will encourage professionalism and leadership.
4. The MSRT will promote education on the work being done by the MSRT and the ASRT.

Qualifications

1. Must be a member in good standing of both MSRT and American Society of Radiologic Technology (ASRT).
2. Must be a student in a Maine medical imaging or radiation therapy program with a 3.0 GPA or higher.
3. "The ASRT SLDP is open only to ASRT Student Members, as determined by the ASRT, eighteen (18) years or older at the time of entry. Winners must be students enrolled in an accredited medical imaging or radiation therapy program at the time of submission." www.asrt.org
4. Students must complete an application form including a letter of reference from their program director and essay as indicated on the application form.



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Guidelines for Selection of Student Delegates for the MSRT

1. The Student Liaison will be responsible to ensure that applications are complete, including MSRT and ASRT membership and that the applicant meets the guidelines of the Student Delegate Program.
2. If there is more than 1 applicant from any 1 program, the Student Liaison will then provide Board members with the information for voting so that a decision can be made as to which candidate from that program will be selected. Only 1 student from each class in a program will be selected as the delegate and administrators and instructors from the College the student is a member of will be excluded from voting. An alternate may be appointed from each class in a program as well.
3. When reviewing the candidates, judging will be based on the student essay and the program director's letter of reference.
4. When candidates are selected the Student Liaison will notify the individuals and be responsible for ensuring the delegates are aware of the meetings and the responsibilities.
5. The Student Liaison will also keep track of attendance and tasks completed by the delegate.
6. When it is time to vote for the ASRT leadership program, the Student Liaison will provide information to Board members for review to include attendance and participation since becoming a member of the MSRT. Administrators and instructors from a medical imaging or radiation therapy program in which a student from their College is a candidate will be excluded from voting.
